

What is 4-H?

4-H is a positive youth development organization which empowers young people to reach their full potential. A community of more than 6 million youth and adults working together for positive change, 4-H enables youth to emerge as leaders through hands-on learning, research-based educational programs and adult mentorship, in order to give back to their community.

Who can Join 4-H?

4-H is for anyone! Kids and adults alike can be involved. Club members are 8 to 18 years old and the Cloverbud program is for youth 5 to 7 years old. Your age is determined on October 1st.

How do you pick a Club?

After deciding to join 4-H, you need to find a club that is suitable for you and your interests. A 4-H club is a group of youth from a variety of ages and backgrounds, supported by adult volunteers, who meet to plan activities, work on projects, serve the community and help you learn.
