MISSOULA COUNTY 4H DOG PROGRAM SUB-NOVICE

** All exercises for Sub-Novice are done ON LEAD

INDIVIDUAL EXERCISES:

1) Heel on Lead & Figure Eight:

Commands for this exercise are "Forward", "Halt", "Slow", "Fast", "Normal" "Right Turn", "Left Turn", "About Turn",

The heel position, as defined by the AKC Obedience Regulation Book:

"The heel position, whether the dog is sitting, standing, lying down, or moving forward, means that the dog shall be straight in line with the direction in which the handler is facing, at the handler's left side and as close as practicable to the handler's left leg without crowding, permitting the handler freedom of motion at all times. The area from the dog's head to shoulders shall be in line with the handler's left hip."

The commands may be given in any sequence and repeated, but the judge will attempt to standardize the heeling pattern for everyone.

The lead will be loose with the dog sitting in the Heel Position when starting this exercise. The judge will ask if the handler is ready, and if so, will say "Forward". A command to heel is given by the handler and the handler will walk <u>briskly</u> and naturally with the dog on a loose lead. Left and right turns will be 90 degree turns. About Turn will <u>always</u> be to the right. At the "Halt" the handler will stop and the dog will promptly sit in the heel position <u>without</u> a command. After each halt, the command to heel may be given again. The judge will say, "Exercise finished", after the Heel On Lead portion is completed.

2) Figure Eight

Two stewards will stand eight feet apart, facing each other. The judge will place the handler and dog in the starting position facing the judge and halfway between the two stewards. The commands will be "Forward", "Halt" and "Exercise Finjshed". The handler may go in either direction (left is easier).

3) Stand For Exam

The principal feature of this exercise is for the dog to stand in position before and during the examination and that the dog does not display shyness or resentment.

The handler will take the dog on lead to the place indicated by the judge. The judge will say, Stand your dog and leave when ready". When the handler is ready (in a reasonable amount of time), the command is given to the dog to stay. The handler will walk to the end of the lead and face the dog. The judge will give the dog a brief exam and say, "Return to your dog". The handler will walk around behind the dog and return with the dog at Heel Position. The dog must remain in place until after the judge says "Exercise finished" and the handler has released the dog.

4) Recall:

The principal feature of this exercise is that the dog will stay where left until called by the handler. The handler will have the dog sitting in the Heel Position. On order from the judge, the handler may give the command to the dog to "Stay" or "Wait", then walk to the end of the lead and face the dog. On the judge's signal, the handler will tell the dog to "Come". The dog must come straight to the handler and sit directly in front of the handler. On the judge's command, the

handler will give the dog a command to "Heel" or "Finish". The manner in which the dog finishes is optional (around the back of the handler or swinging to the left of the handler) provided the dog finishes sitting straight in the heel position.

GROUP EXERCISES

The principal feature of these exercises is for the dog to remain in the sitting position until released by the handler.

1) Long Sit:

This exercise is done as a group with all of the dogs in the ring at the same time. (The judge may decide to split the group if there are a large number of entries.) Handlers and dogs will be lined up on one side of the ring with dogs sitting at heel position. Order from the judge, all handlers will give the dogs the command to sit. The judge will then say, "Leave your dog." The handlers will give the dogs the "stay" command and/or signal, walk to the end of the lead and face their dogs. After one minute the judge will say, "Return to your dog." Handlers will return around behind the dogs and up to the heel position. The dogs must not move from the sitting position until after the judge says "Exercise finished."

2) Long Down:

This is also a group exercise. This exercise begins with the dogs sitting at heel position. The judge will give the handlers the command to down their dogs. The handlers will give their dogs the command and/or signal to Down. They will NOT touch the dogs or collars, they will NOT guide the dogs down with the lead. The judge will tell the handlers to leave their dogs. Handlers will give the "stay" command and/or signal, walk to the end of the lead and face their dogs. After three minutes, the judge will tell the handlers to return to their dogs. Handlers will return around behind the dogs and up to the heel position. Dogs may not move from the down position until after the judge says, "Exercise finished."

Heel:

Improper heel position
Occasional tight lead
Lagging behind or forging ahead
Excessive sniffing on the ground
Extra commands to heel
No change of pace (fast/slow)
No sits

^{**} If your dog gets up and attempts to come to you, pull him to you and have him sit in the recall position so as not to disturb the other dogs

Stand for Exam:

Resistance to handler posing
Extra commands to stay
Growling or shying away from judge
Moving during exam
Moving after exam
Sits as handler returns

Recall:

Handler's arms not at sides
Dog stood or lay down
Dog did not return to handler
Extra command to come
No sit in front
Poor sit
Poor finish
Leaving handler

Long sit:

Handler guides or forces dog to sit
Dog lay down or stands before handler returns
Excessive whining or barking
Disturbing other dogs
Stood or lay down after handler returns (before being released)

Long Down:

Handler guides or forces dog to lie down
Dog sits or stands before handler returns
Excessive whining or barking
Excessive sniffing
"Creeping" out of place
Disturbing other dogs
Excessive movement
Dog sits or stands after handler returns (before being released)

*Any dog who fouls the ring or leaves the ring is automatically disqualified

^{**} Any dog that is overly aggressive, out of control, attacks another dog or starts a dog fight will automatically be disqualified and asked to leave the ring.
