

Missoula County Youth in Restoration Project

Background:

This summer the Missoula County Weed District will be implementing the fourth year of the *Youth in Restoration Program*. Through this program high school students work 30 hours per week for 8-9 weeks contributing to vegetation management projects and other conservation efforts for supporting land managing agencies including: BLM Missoula Field Office, City of Missoula Conservation Lands, University of Montana Natural Areas, Lolo National Forest, Missoula County Parks, The Nature Conservancy, Department of Natural Resources and Conservation, Fish, Wildlife & Parks and Five Valleys Land Trust. High school students selected to participate in this project will conduct biological insect control collections and releases on public land, aquatic monitoring of area lakes and streams, mapping and monitoring natural resources, mechanical weed control, revegetation, as well as education and outreach in Missoula County and the surrounding region.

By working directly with local agencies to support natural resource conservation actions, students will develop a deeper appreciation for our public lands, understanding of multiple use management, and the ecological and economical balance that agencies strive to maintain. Students will have the opportunity to work with a variety of resource professionals in many different disciplines throughout the summer, providing them with knowledge and insight to the types of career paths available in natural resource management. This will prove to be valuable experience to the students participating when applying for future employment or colleges. Work experience through and indirectly for the federal/county government funded by a national grant will be impressive on a resume.

Duties:

Four high school students will be hired to work 30 hours a week for 8-9 weeks during the summer of 2016.

Requirements: work in hot summer conditions in the direct sun, hike 1-5 miles at a time, handle non-threatening insects, occasionally work Saturdays, possess strong organizational skills, use GPS units (or be willing to learn), and work as a team.

Duties: collecting insects and data on insects and/or plants, hiking to project areas, manually removing weeds, revegetating areas with native plants, removing/installing wildlife barriers, surveying aquatic plants, working with young students during day camps, and assisting the Missoula County Weed District with outreach programs (Farmer's Market, County Fair, Community Weed Pulls, Agency Collection Days, etc.).

The students need to have the ability to get to the Missoula County Weed District office (2825 Santa Fe Court, Missoula, MT 59808). From this location the Missoula County Crew Leader will be responsible for driving students to and from work sites. Work sites will include areas throughout Missoula County and occasionally other regional sites managed by the BLM, Forest Service, City of Missoula and other participating organizations.
